## **BC Human Rights Code supersedes everything**

No discrimination against person(s) because of "race, colour, ancestry, place of origin, religion, marital status, family status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, or age".

## What is the BCPSEA?

 It is the accredited bargaining agent for the BC's 60 public boards of education and negotiates with the BCTF (the teachers' union) for a teachers' collective agreement.

 BCPSEA creates a local "working document" for each school district, which incorporates both the provincially and locally negotiated changes.
